## THE INTENTION TO WITHDRAW INDUSTRY DISPENSATIONS UNDER THE DAIRY PRODUCTS AND IMITATION DAIRY PRODUCTS REGULATIONS (R.260 OF 27 MARCH 2015)

1. The following industry dispensations listed in the table below were issued from 17 September 2015 until 21 May 2018 to deviate from the requirements in the Regulations relating to the classification, packing and marking of Dairy Products and Imitation Dairy Products intended for sale in the Republic of South Africa (R.260 of 27 March 2015):

- 2. The Executive Officer: Agricultural Product Standards Act 119 of 1990 hereby intends to withdraw the above mentioned industry dispensations, due to the fact that the Agricultural Product Standards Act 119 of 1990 provides for the Minister only to make regulations, and the Executive Officer therefore does not have the powers to amend the promulgated regulations by means of an industry dispensation.
- 3. The withdrawal concerned will be executed in terms of section 16 (3) (b) of the Agricultural Product Standards Act 119 of 1990.
- 4. The Directorate: Food Safety and Quality Assurance will work with the dairy industry and other stakeholders in following the correct procedures to implement amendments to regulation R.260 dated 27 March 2015. A draft regulation with all the industry dispensations concerned incorporated will be circulated for comments by no later than the 28th February 2019.
- 5. It has to be noted however that the industry dispensations in question will remain valid during this period of amending the *dairy products and imitation dairy products regulations*.
